COLLEGES AT XAVIER UNIVERSITY

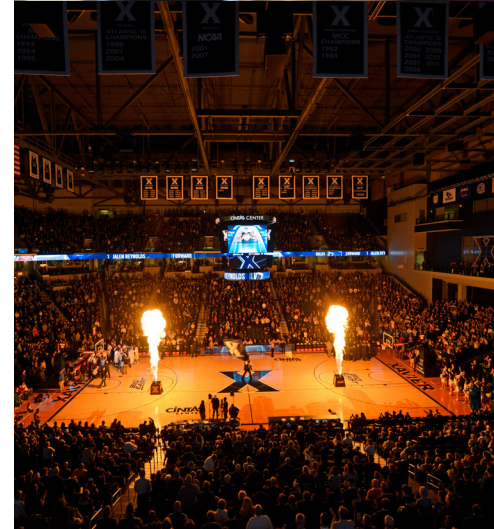
Xavier is home to the College of Arts and Sciences, the College of Professional Sciences, the Williams College of Business and the College of Nursing.

The **College of Arts and Sciences** is the oldest and largest college at Xavier University. The college provides an excellent liberal arts education in the Jesuit tradition that prepares students for careers, professional or graduate school, and life in a global society. Top majors in this college include Philosophy, Politics, and The Public, Communication Studies, Biology, and Computer Science.
